- ★ Express your feelings in a controlled and measured way considering how your words may impact on others
- ★ Ask powerful questions and questions to extend your thinking

- ★ Actively listen when people are talking
- ★ Let people finish their sentences
- ★ Show appropriate body language for listening
- ★ Be open minded to other people's thoughts and ideas
- ★ Have empathy for others and their feelings and seek to understand
- ★ Listen to learn and develop your own or your team's ideas further

COLLABORATION

To apply the value of collaboration to your behaviour, you need to:

- ★ Consider how best to contribute when working with others within our school and with the wider world and use initiative
- ★ Ensure others have a turn to speak

- ★ Compromise within a team and resolve conflict using negotiation
- ★ Know when and how to seek support

Thinking about how your words and actions make other people feel

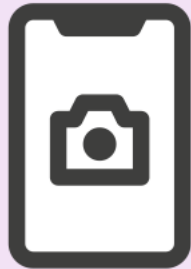
Not putting pressure on someone and accepting their boundaries

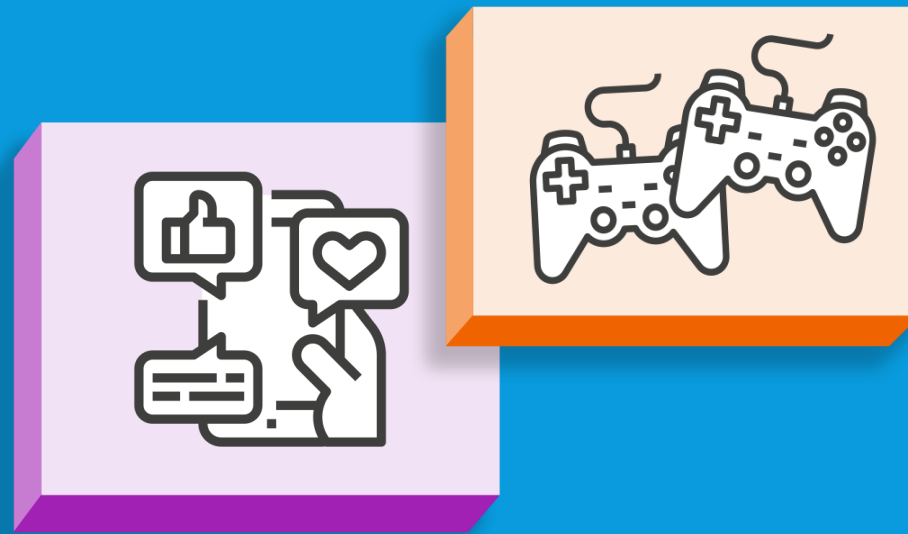

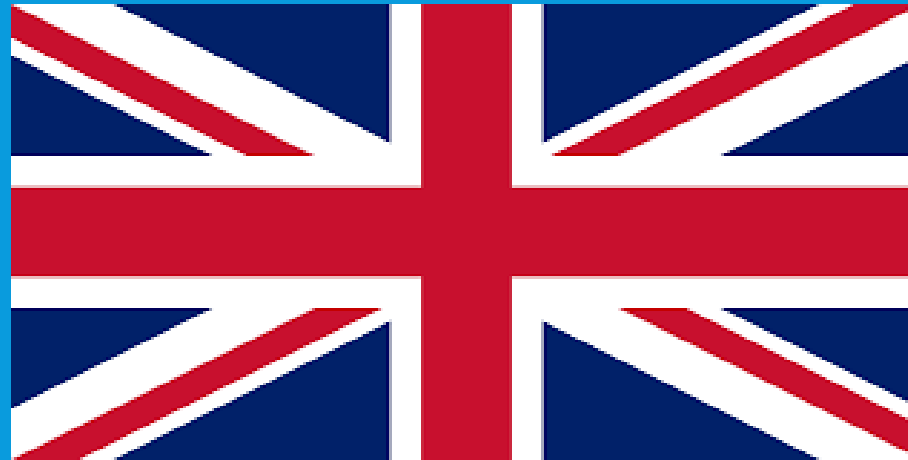
