Your child will:

- Develop their ability to write a diary entry, including the use of noun phrases, conjunctions and a range of punctuation.
- Develop their ability to write their own narrative including the use of a wide range of punctuation, adverbial phrases and conjunctions
- Develop their ability to write a poem, including the use of similes, metaphors and the use of alliteration.
- Have daily spelling, reading skills and handwriting lessons.

learn:

Fractions

- To count in fractions
- To find equivalent fractions
- To add and subtract fractions
- To solve problems involving fractions
- To understand improper fractions
- To convert mixed numbers to improper fractions

Decimals

- To understand tenths as fractions
- To be able to divide 1-digit numbers by 10
- To be able to divide 2-digit numbers by 10
- To understand hundredths as decimals
- To understand hundredths as decimals on a place value grid
